



3. The experimental VR pilot case of a serious game to simulate financial investigation









 Furthermore, the course has been listed among the courses that UNIMIB proposes to high school students within the context of the NRRP (National Recovery and Resilience Plan). This implies that 15 hours of lessons are directly given at high schools under this course.







## VR Serious Game

In cooperation with Agenfor International Foundation, recognized by the Italian Ministry of the Interior, and MiBTec laboratory (UNIMIB Psychlogy Department), we are developing a VR training activity to enable the participants to take part in the simulation of an EPPO investigation.







The experience will allow the users to follow the events related to a simulated prosecution process from a first-person perspective centered on 4 different characters usually involved in the process (a European Public Prosecutor, a Lawyer, a Suspect and a Financial Policeman).

# The Closing round table (18° April)
