THE NUMBERS


An average of 310 class participants (reaching up to 789 participants) belonging to the following categories*:

- University students (reaching up to 288 students).
- Lawyers (reaching up to 70 lawyers).
- Hight school students within the PCTO and PNRR project (reaching up to 177 students).
- Law enforcement officers (reaching up to 65 officers).
- Academics (reaching up to 6 academics).
- Charted accountants (reaching up to 24 chartered accountants).
- Others (reaching up to 139 people).
- * Data updated to 21 April 2023. The data are in continuous evolution.


THE MODALITIES:




